- Supporting = **49**
- Not Supporting = 27
- Neither = 2

How many signs would you prefer?

- 2 Signs = **36**
- 3 Signs = **6**
- 7 Signs = **11**
- (2 people voted more than one choice)

What style of sign would you prefer?

- No Pictorial = **12**
- Simple Pictorial = **29**
- Intermediate Pictorial = 7
- High Level Pictorial = 6
- (3 people voted more than one choice)





Suggestions/Comments from the Survey

Grouped for ease of reading.

<u>Positive</u>

- May help with speeding
- Would be lovely to have improved signs
- A very good idea
- A 'must-do'
- Existing entry signs are a disgrace
- Will look fabulous
- Lovely signs would benefit the parish
- Essential as we look like the 'poor relations' of other Trent Valley villages.
- New sign would be an improvement.
- pleased that we are to have new signs
- Could put a Lancaster bomber on the sign pictorial.
- Could put parish church on signs as it is the centre of the village.
- Cost could be spread over several years
- Could be phased over 4-5 years.
- Can purchase be spread over 2 years?
- Perhaps you could replace them gradually over 3 years
- Perhaps a sign purchased every financial year?
- Extra signs could be purchased in future years
- Don't be put off by the cost
- I'm sure most would donate to this
- We should set up a fund to help finance this
- Fiskerton's is nicer than East Bridgford's sign.
- Fiskerton sign is simple and effective
- No pictorial would be more welcoming.
- The simpler the better
- Same as Caunton sign
- We prefer the East Bridgford sign with gold balls
- East Bridgford example is better than Fiskerton
- We like the Hockerton one
- Choice B or C depending on the incremental cost
- More colourful ones look tacky
- Replace old signs in similar places
- Represent our Salvation Army connections



- Signs will need replacing but spend the minimum
- Very happy the Parish Council is doing this
- Rolleston has nice signs
- Need Gibsmere signs too don't do half a job!
- 1 sign each for Bleasby, Goverton and Gibsmere
- Not fair if signs are only for Bleasby
- 'All or none' most equitable outcome
- Bleasby, Gibsmere and Goverton Welcomes Careful Drivers'
- A combined sign to include Bleasby, Goverton and Gibsmere
- Could 'Goverton and Gibsmere' be incorporated into the signs instead of 'Careful Drivers' as is it even taken notice of on other signs?
- It makes much more sense to erect three, or Goverton and Gibsmere will look like the poor relatives. Otherwise don't bother and the whole area will look like the poor relatives.
- We consider it important to unite Bleasby, Goverton and Gibsmere in one sign 'Parish of Bleasby'
- Goverton deserves inclusion and more council spending.
- Do it over several years and have 7 signs to include Government and Gibsmere
- It doesn't feel right to only replace Bleasby signs
- One sign approaching Goverton saying 'Goverton in the Parish of Bleasby Welcomes Careful Drivers'
- One at entrance to Gibsmere saying 'Gibsmere in the Parish of Bleasby Welcomes Careful Drivers
- One at entrance to Bleasby from Fiskerton end just before the 7 hornbeams and on the left-hand side

'The Parish of Bleasby – Including Goverton and Gibsmere with Hazelford near the Ancient Crossing of the Trent- Welcomes Considerate Drivers'

<u>Neutral</u>

- Where would funds otherwise be spent?
- Seems we have no choice as everyone else has them.
- As well as present signs?
- 'No Speed Limit' signs should be repositioned on Goverton Hill or a new 30 sign to stop confusion.
- New signs would be nice but not at the expense of more necessary improvements.
- Remove erroneous Goverton/Bleasby sign as Goverton continues to the railway.



- Should only encourage replies to this survey once matching grant is a certainty.
- Would support additional signs if funding is available
- Keep present signs clean
- Can someone local make/design one cheaper?
- Need a plan to keep them clean
- Additional signs more speeding signs on Main Street
- Ask Network Rail to tidy their area near the railway as it looks so untidy

Negative

- Current signs are acceptable
- Seems a lot of money
- £4,000 per sign seems a lot
- Lovely but too expensive
- Huge waste of money
- At £4000 per sign no!
- £4000 for a sign that doesn't need replacing???
- Why would it ever be considered spending so much money?
- Would expect signs engraved in gold for this money!
- Purchasing signs would be a ridiculous waste of money
- In these straightened economic time it would be wrong to spend tax payers' money on frivolous items like signs
- Why do we need to fritter the funds away?
- Based on precept this is a huge cost
- Please don't waste hard earned cash
- In these hard times spending money replacing signs is silly
- The signs are fine as they are
- Complete waste of funds
- This is not a priority!
- Seems an unnecessary expense.
- Not necessary to spend money renewing signs.
- Signs are perfectly adequate.
- Keep existing plain ones to distinguish each area separately
- We already have signs just not fancy ones.
- Signs are ok already.
- No need to pay to keep signs clean and tidy



- PC should take account of inflation and family economics.
- PC should also advise on present Reserves as well as 2023/24 precept
- No need for fussy motto or picture
- Put the money into the village.
- Spend money instead on more frequent verge cutting, more flowerboxes, more tree planting, bulb planting e.g daffodils which could have a much better impact
- Use spare funds caring for green spaces which give pleasure to everyone
- Expense could be spent on more important things
- We don't need to advertise Bleasby it's nice enough
- Money could be better spent on a children's park
- Play equipment instead?
- A play area would be good
- Would support children's play equipment.
- No village facilities which isn't right

- Village in dire need of play equipment

- Save money for when real investments are necessary such as flood defences
- Could be spent on trees/churchyard/Jubilee Ponds/paint benches/planters/high cost events

- Support events
- Improve the appearance of Bleasby crossing and Railway station
- Support local groups with the funds instead
- Rather you spent the money on clearing the ditches out
- Use funds to improve the roads
- Prioritise potholes, road resurfacing and park
