Chair Cllr P Cast opened with the following comments:

- Thank you to all volunteers working behind the scenes to make the parish a better place to live.
- Members were also actively encouraging residents to consider becoming a Councillor at the forthcoming election to be held 2<sup>nd</sup> May 2019.

# BPC 19-733 Apologies – acceptance and approval.

Apologies received from Cllr C Gent were accepted and approved.

# BPC 19-734 Questions and petitions from the public

- Concerns expressed over the site location of a new footpath sign in the Churchyard. It was deemed to be an insensitive place and with no consultation over its location.
- Some mowing had been undertaken already around Glebe Field features and the churchyard.

# **BPC 19-735 Reports from County & District Councillors.**

# Cllr S Saddington NCC confirmed the following: -

- An electronic payment for a donation £100 would be made towards new signs for the village.
- Noted that Gibsmere potholes require investigating by Cllr. S Saddington.

# **Cllr R Blaney N&SDC**

 Confirmed that in relation to Network Rail that day there had been a total power failure at Derby which affected all East Midlands and trains were not running, causing utter chaos across the network. Crossings across the network were not operating properly.
 Cllr. Blaney had been in touch with Network Rail and a full investigation would take place.

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# BPC 19-737 Agenda items deemed Private & Confidential

# BPC 19-738 Presentation and approval of minutes of the meeting held on 11<sup>th</sup> February 2019.

The minutes of meeting held on 11<sup>th</sup> February 2019 were approved & signed.

# BPC 19-739 Matters arising from the minutes not included in this agenda

- Condition of Boat Lane awaiting response from Cllr. Saddington
- Network Rail were cutting trees back alongside the railway line including on private land;
   concerns expressed as land owners had not been contacted.
- Flying of flags at the memorial appreciated by residents and prompted further interest in the memorial, meaning of the flags etc.
- Trent Valley Internal Drainage Board would dredge the dyke along the Glebe Field boundary with Gypsy Lane free of charge if it was undertaken during its programme this summer; outside of that timeframe it would result in a charge being made.
- F4RN questionnaire were distributed around the parish with approximately 20 properties taking up the offer so far.

#### BPC 19-740 Land and Assets:

- Jubilee Ponds Update School science week is running the week commencing 11<sup>th</sup>
   March 2019 and school children would be visiting the site throughout the week as part
   of the science initiative. Village volunteers had assisted clearing the Centenary Wood of
   remaining tree roots on 9<sup>th</sup> March 2019 and this had gone well. Members of the public
   could dedicate trees to loved ones & dedications would also be recorded in a book to
   mark the occasion.
- **Ferry End Update** Positive responses in relation to volunteers undertaking riverside clearance work. Additional seeding was now required.
- Works necessary for March Approved cut of Glebe Field at a cost of £45. Councillor
  Foster volunteered to cut the Meadow as it was necessary to get an early spring cut.

# **BPC 19-741 Update from Support Groups.**

Flood Action Group – The clearing of the dyke along Gypsy Lane would be undertaken around August/September by Trent Valley Internal Drainage Board.
 On 13<sup>th</sup> March a group to meet with NCC officers to work closely with the group as a pilot project with a view to roll out to other groups the administration of such a project.

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- Countryside and Footpaths Group Walk undertaken 17<sup>th</sup> February 2019. Generally footpaths were good & with input from Ramblers Association and the ROW team new footpath signs had been installed. The main problem was dog fouling agreed to put article in Bleasby News highlighting need to clean up after dogs.
- Village Volunteers Special thanks due to all those for all their hard work.

  Field to be cut at a cost of £45 per cut & lengthsman's work also to be covered.
  Due to the absence of Cllr. Gent additional queries from councillors could not be
  answered, therefore agreed to hold an additional meeting to confirm details of
  financial aspects of the Ulyett's contract.

Thanks were expressed to Councillor Gent for managing the Council finances, despite illness, during the Clerk vacancy period. The importance of adopting the Scribe software had been highlighted by this interim period, as was the possible need to outsource the management of the future Clerk's salary payments.
