Federations

All WIs are grouped together in county and island federations. Bleasby WI is part of the Nottinghamshire Federation with its HQ at County House in Newark, by the castle. The Federation organises educational talks, craft, arts, social and sport activities throughout the county. The list is endless and details are published in a monthly newsletter The Hornblower.

Members are also kept in touch with events and other members' activities and opinions by our National Federation; they receive a magazine, WI Life, every month.

Resolutions:

Each year all WI members have the chance to vote on issues that they want the national body to campaign and raise awareness on. Past national campaigns have included equal pay, climate change, mental health, cleaner rivers, violence against women and modern slavery.
